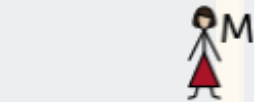




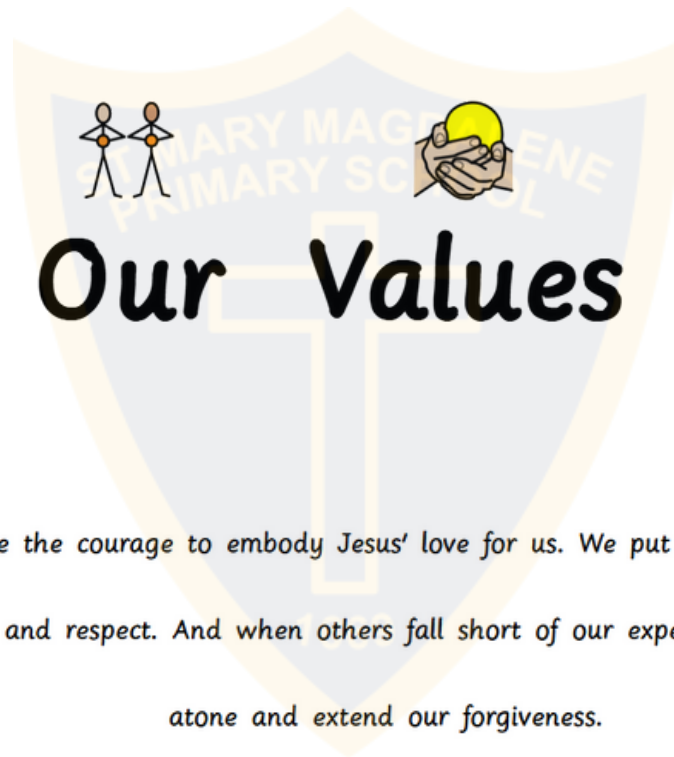
St Mary's Safeguarding Policy for Children

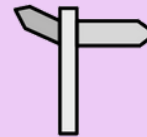
? How we will protect you:



- We will provide a safe and secure environment for you to learn in progress

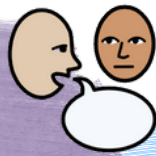


- We help to ensure that you are safe at home as well as at school.



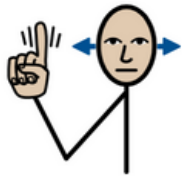
- We think it is important for you to know where to get help if you are worried or unhappy about something.

If somebody shouts, threatens, hits or hurts somebody you love whilst you are around.



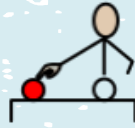
Is someone bullying you?

Bullying is when someone keeps hurting another person on purpose over and over. It can happen because one person has more power than the other. Bullying can be hitting, saying mean things, or making someone feel bad. It can happen in person or on the internet.
