This week, we received a letter from the three bears thanking us for helping them! Unfortunately, there is another problem: Goldilocks has gone missing. The children worked hard during their independent learning to create wanted posters. Hopefully, someone will find Goldilocks soon. In Maths, we have been consolidating our learning on estimation, measuring height, and length. The children have really grown in confidence when it comes to reasoning and problem-solving. This week, we applied the map skills we learned this half-term by going on an Easter hunt! The children were very excited to find the chocolate. During our outdoor learning session, we created our Easter gardens. The children used natural resources to build the different parts needed for the gardens.

## Y1 - Miss Bower

Another lovely week this week we have been practising measuring volume and capacity and using words such as more, less, full, empty, half full and nearly empty. We finished our letters to the Prime Minister, and we have done a fantastic job! I am super proud of the hard work children have put into these. We had a fantastic school trip to Cleethorpes, enjoyed our Easter pilgrimage and learnt a lot about Holy Week. In DT we evaluated our boats and discussed how we would improve these next time and thought about if we would use different tools if we were to do these again. Have a lovely half term.

## Y2 - Mrs Turvey

Y2 have had a great final week to the term! In English, we've completed a letter writing in role as James to the insects to thank them for letting James live with them and travel around the world, helping him to escape his nasty aunts. We've had some fantastic writing with many children using subordination and exclamation sentences. In maths, we've completed our final unit on measurement where we've been looking at temperature and capacity. We've practised measuring in millilitres and litres, reading scales and solving problems linked to capacity and temperature. In Art we've completed our final outcomes. These were based on the work of Quentin Blake where we focused on tone, colour, proportion, and shape to produce our final piece. In PE We've enjoyed our final lesson where we've been able to play mini basketball games against each other practising are attacking and defending skills that we've learnt this half term. Within the provision we've had some fantastic collaborative construction where children have used a range of materials to create zoos, farms, and marble runs. Many children have also been using the outdoor area this week where they've been producing nature art and working together to create woodwork pieces.

## Y3 - Miss Wain

This week Year 3 have continued to learn about length and have been comparing lengths this week. We looked at converting all the measurements into cm and working from there. In English, we have completed a diary entry in the role of Ernest Shackleton. The children loved the informal use of language! In RE, the children explored Eid and Ramadan. We created our own tokens to spread joy within school and shared this with Foundation. In Geography, the children looked at how humans affect climate change and the impact their actions have on the speed that this is occurring. In Music, the children have completed their composed pieces to represent Beowulf going to slay the Beast: Grendell. They really enjoyed exploring with the instruments and filming their final piece. In Art, the children completed their printed tile pieces onto a map background. They rolled the paint and pressed their tiles down. In Computing, the children did their final online safety and thought carefully about their own safety when accessing online content. They had a great time leading the Easter Service and taking part in the Easter Pilgrimage.

## Y4 - Miss Cave

Year 4 have had a lovely last week of term. They have been super busy writing setting descriptions about fairgrounds as part of their independent writing. They have been using some beautiful descriptive vocabulary such as 'vibrant lights, dizzying heights, scrumptious food'. In Maths, the children have been completing their fractions unit and have been subtracting fractions from whole numbers. The children are now much more confident with this! The children absolutely loved the Easter pilgrimage day and making crosses/crowns of thorns using sticks linked to Good Friday. The children demonstrated love and respect for all other children in the school and supported them to make their own crosses and crowns. In Geography, the children have been thinking about biomes and climate zones. They conducted their own research to find out the biomes and climate zones of Brazil, Argentina, North America and the UK. This research helped them to easily compare the countries. Finally, the children have been finishing their final art pieces based on Pablo Picasso's 1908. We went outdoors and used nature to inspire our pieces using oil pastels.

## Y5 - Mrs Pearson

Year 5 have continued their unit on Decimals and Percentages in Maths, they have been focussing on thousandths. In English, the children have really enjoyed creating their suspense stories based on Oliver Twist, they have thought carefully about the vocabulary that they would need to create tension. They have continued their unit on LS Lowry in Art and have been focussing on one point perspective. In PE, they have completed their Basketball unit and played mini games. In History, they have completed their learning on Queen Victoria and have written a report on the impact that she made on Britain. The children have thoroughly enjoyed their immersive RE experience this week where they took part in our Easter Pilgrimage. The children are now very much looking forward to a well deserved rest. After half term, they will be focussing on WW1.

## Y6 - Miss Smith

Year 6 have had a busy week with lots of Maths and English! In Maths, they have learnt about line graphs, percentages in pie charts, how to draw pie charts and how to calculate the mean. In English, they have written their own formal letters demanding that camp Greenlake be closed down forever! In RE, they have consolidated their learning by answering their overarching question which was then incorporated into the Easter Pilgrimage. In Art, they have considered how the artwork affects them and how the artist has used proportion, exposure and aperture to create a specific mood. In Science, they have learnt about the ray model and how this can be used with imaging onto mirrors. In basketball, they have competed in several games using the skills they have learnt throughout the last six weeks. The children have worked extremely hard during this term and should be very proud of themselves!
